INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

INSTALLATION

Install the Solar Cover on the pool with the *bubbles down and the smooth side up*. The blanket is easily cut with ordinary scissors to fit any size pool. Allow the blanket to float on the pool a few days to allow the packaging wrinkles to smooth out. Be careful not to cut too much material off. Cut the Solar Cover larger than necessary and then give it a final trimming for a better fit.

SOLAR HEATING

Leslie's Solar Cover transfers the sun's heat into the pool and keeps it there, raising the water temperature as much as 10° while the solar cover is in place. For proper heat retention and to get the most value from your Solar Cover, the pool should be covered at all times—except when swimming. However, water temperatures above 90° (F) can shorten the life of the Solar Cover. When your pool thermometer reads 90°, the Solar Cover should be removed.

An uncovered pool at night can lose four to five degrees of heat, but this heat loss can be cut to as little as one degree with Leslie's Solar Cover on the pool.

REMOVAL OF THE SOLAR COVER

To remove the Solar Cover, pull off several feet at a time and fan fold it on the deck or roll it up from one end. Cover it with the poly plastic cover.

CAUTION

The Solar Cover must be protected from sunlight when not in use on the pool. When folded or rolled up and exposed to the sun's rays, Leslie's Solar Cover generates temperatures hot enough to damage the aircell material a few layers inside the folds. When the Solar Cover is off the pool, store it in a shaded area and cover it with the poly plastic bag supplied with it. The Solar Cover must not be dragged across abrasive decks, rough coping, or any ragged surface that may damage the bubbles and shorten the Solar Cover's life.

Leslie's Solar Cover will cut evaporation and reduce the amount of pool chemicals used. It is most important to check the chlorine level to be sure it does not rise about 1 ppm; and when you "Super-chlorinate" (above 1.5 ppm), the Solar Cover must be removed from the pool to avoid shortening its life.

CLEANING AND STORAGE

Most of the dirt and debris can be washed off the Solar Cover with a hose while it floats in the pool. Turn on your filter pump and head the dirt and leaves into the skimmer and through the filter. Any heavier grime on the Solar Cover can usually be removed with a brush and the garden hose. After you've cleaned the Solar Cover, fold it into convenient widths and roll it up from one end. Now you can store it standing on end or in the plastic bag in a shaded area where the temperature does not go above 120°(F). If you are planning to store it for any length of time, it is better to let it dry before rolling it up. This will keep mildew from forming in the moisture trapped in the folds of the Solar Cover.

Your Leslie's Solar Cover has been made with care and with the finest material available. Properly used, it should pay for itself many times over in money saved on chemicals and pool heating costs—and in the added enjoyment of your pool.
